Meet our new governor - Ralph Hudson

As a Chartered Engineer and Director of three small companies, Ralph has a track record of working with advanced technologies that support the urgently needed transition to a sustainable economy. He acts as the North Hill Parish Council representative on climate change and is currently leading an investigation on behalf of the Regenerative Food and Farming community to establish whether there is a business case to harvest and process industrial hemp in the County. These and other lines of enquiry keep him in regular contact with members of the County Council and he actively encourages initiatives that strengthen the local economy.



His expertise combines a strategic knowledge of energy related and renewable technologies, systems engineering and many years' experience of project and contract management in the procurement of large software based automation systems. As the lead systems engineer for the Home Energy Systems Gateway project, he helped the Energy Systems Catapult refine its requirements for the UK's future domestic heating strategy. In 2016, he led the process that advised DECC, now BEIS, on how the UK's electrical power networks should evolve to meet the country's climate change obligations. This engagement in energy strategy was built on 15 years in consultancy with the BMT Group and a career as a marine engineer officer in the Royal Navy's submarine service.
