We would like to send a 'big congratulations' to our Year 6s & 2s on completion of this year's SATs.


Thank you to all of the parents who provided packed lunches yesterday as the hall was out of bounds as it was being used as a polling station

#### Attendance

In our last Ofsted report (October 2016) it stated that we need to;

Persevere with efforts to improve attendance, especially of pupils who are disadvantaged or who have special educational needs and/or disabilities.

For the first half of the summer term, we currently have 37 pupils achieving 100% and another 17 pupils achieving 95% or higher, lets hope we can see these figures increase



by the end of the summer term.

We will only be able to authorise a leave of absence if exceptional circumstances and attendance is 95% or higher.
